Kees Dorst (1965) was trained as an Industrial Design Engineer at the Delft University of Technology, and studied some philosophy at the Erasmus University Rotterdam. Since obtaining his Master's degree in 1989 he has worked as a designer for various design firms, participating in about fifty projects. He is now a part-time assistant professor in the Department of New Product Development of the Faculty of Industrial Design Engineering.
